Principal's Statement



As Principal and Chief Executive of Derwentside College, it is a pleasure to present our 2015-16 Annual Report. This has been another successful year and I am proud of the students and staff for their continued hard work.

As demonstrated by our mission and vision, we are relentless in our focus on developing the employability of our learners as well as our services to employers. We are one of the largest and most successful apprenticeship providers in the country and in 2015-16, we had 6,205 apprentices and worked with 1,193 employers. Whilst many of our learners are located in County Durham, we also deliver apprenticeships across Tyne and Wear, Northumberland, Tees Valley and Yorkshire and Humber.

We continue to perform well financially, despite significant funding cuts across the sector and in 2015-16 we returned another healthy surplus.

Success rates on our classroom-based courses continue to be very high, placing us again in the top 10% of all colleges. Our apprenticeship success rates are also well above the national rates and in some areas significantly so. In April 2016, we had a very successful Ofsted inspection in which Ofsted once again judged the College to be Good overall. I am pleased to report that, according to the government's latest published statistics, the College has the highest percentage of young people with sustained progression into education, training or employment in the North East region. Furthermore, we also have the highest percentage of young people progressing into apprenticeships in the country.

Throughout 2015-16, we continued to build on our outstanding partnership with Jobcentre Plus in continually aligning our programmes to local job vacancy trends. The building of our new construction facility is one such example. Now one year on from opening the doors to our new centre, over 300 learners have benefitted from this provision.

I would like to thank the College's staff and the staff of our strategic partners for their unwavering dedication to helping our learners achieve truly amazing outcomes. I would also like to thank College Board Members for their on-going dedication and their invaluable support.

Ofsted - April 2016

Derwentside College is relentless in its approach to improving learner outcomes and attaining very high standards of training. Achievement rates on our courses have been high for many years, placing the College firmly amongst the top colleges in the country. In April 2016, the College had a very successful Ofsted inspection. Ofsted once again judged the College to be Good overall with exceptional strengths including:

- Very effective partnerships with employers results in high achievement rates for learners and apprentices;

Our Partnership with Sterling Pharma Solutions

Occupying a site near Cramlington, in Northumberland, Sterling Pharma Solutions is one of the employers that's been making a real impression on the North East's regeneration and drive for success. The company has a culture of actively developing the skills and knowledge of their workforce, and in recent years they have progressed this commitment through the apprenticeship route.

Working in partnership with Derwentside College, Sterling has 80 intermediate, advanced and higher apprentices in various areas across the plant who have recently achieved or who are currently undertaking their apprenticeship.



Manager of the Pilot Plant, Steve Slater, explains: "The Pilot Plant is where we employ Technicians who have progressed from Operator level - it's their first step into being self-supervising, so we need to support them with training and development. They learn as they work, with assessors from the College supporting them as they progress. We have tried various providers for our apprenticeships, but the service we get from Derwentside College is second to none. Their assessors are as committed to the success of our apprentices as we are and the support service is excellent."
