How to Enrol

Course Fees

You will find details of course fees throughout this leaflet. If you are unemployed or in receipt of certain benefits, you may be eligible for free tuition.

We define a learner as unemployed if one or more of the following apply:

- you receive Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA), including if you receive National Insurance credits only
- you receive Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- you receive Universal Credit, and your earned income from employment (disregarding benefits) is less than £338 a month, or £541 a month if you have a joint benefit claim with your partner.

You may be fully funded at our discretion if all of the following apply:

- · you receive other state benefits not listed above, and
- your earned income (disregarding benefits) is less than £338 a month, or £541 a month if you have a joint benefit claim with your partner, and
- you want to be employed, or progress into more sustainable employment and your course will help with this.

Your course may also be **free** if you are:

- Aged 16 18
- Aged 19 23 and studying for your first full Level 2 or Level 3 qualification



How to Pay

You can pay by cash or debit/credit card. Some courses can be paid for via monthly instalments. Please ask for further details.

If your employer has agreed to pay your fees, you will need written confirmation from your employer when you enrol.

Financial Support

Financial support may be available for eligible learners. The **Learner Support Fund** can assist you with travel to college, books, specialist clothing and equipment. In addition, daytime students can be assisted with meals and childcare support.

Low Wage Fee Remission

Adults who earn less than £16,009.50 may be entitled to FREE tuition on funded courses. Please ask for further details at the time of enrolment.

If you are eligible for FREE tuition as part of the Low Wage entitlement, you will need to supply us with some supporting evidence when you enrol.

Advanced Learner Loan - study now, pay later!

Don't let worries about paying for your course hold you back... If you are aged 19 or over and applying to study at Level 3 or above, you could be eligible for a student loan.

Advanced Learner Loan

An Advanced Learner Loan covers the cost of your course fees and is easy to apply for. It doesn't take your household income into account and doesn't involve a credit check. Repayments are linked to what you earn and not how much you borrowed.

You only have to start making repayments when you've finished your course and you're earning over £25,725 a year. Until then you don't need to payback anything.

If you receive a loan to study for an Access to HE course, and then move on to do a HE course, your loan for your Access course will be written off once you complete your HE qualification.

Courses marked with are eligible for an Advanced Learner Loan

Do I qualify for a loan?

To qualify for a loan you must:

- Be aged 19 or over at the start of your course
- Be resident in the UK for 3 years prior to the start of your course
- Be studying an eligible course at level 3 or above

Access to Higher Education

The Access to Higher Education diploma is ideal for students wishing to study a diverse range of subjects within the social sciences, including teaching, nursing and social work.

Pathways offered are:

- **Humanities and Social Sciences**
- Education
- Health

Access to Higher Education will be studied over 3.5 days per week for 33 weeks. Starts w/c 23 September. Course Fee - £3,000 (Advanced Learner Loan available).

Pre-Access - Skills for Higher Level Study

Our Pre-Access course is ideal if you would like to study the Access to Higher Education course but haven't got the necessary GCSE grades. It is suited to adults who have been out of education for some time and who need to re-learn how to study at a higher level before progressing onto the Access programme.

Pre-Access will be studied over 2 days per week (plus an evening for English and Maths if required) for 33 weeks. Starts w/c 23 September. Course Registration Fee - £60
